The Country of Namibia

Namibia is a country in the southern part of the continent of Africa. The Atlantic Ocean is to the west of Africa while the Indian Ocean is on the east. The southern tip of Africa is occupied by the country called South Africa. Namibia is located just north of South Africa on the Atlantic Coast of Africa. Parts of Namibia once were colonial territories claimed by

Portugal, Germany and South Africa but in 1990 Namibia finally became an independent nation.

A little over 2 million people live in Namibia. About 38% of the population or three quarters of a million people live in urban areas and the rest live in the countryside or small towns. About 20,000 people in Namibia are of German descent. German is one of the eleven national languages in Namibia. Beginning in the 1860s some parts of Namibia inland from the Atlantic Coast were once a German colony. As a result many buildings in Namibia are in the same style as German buildings. After being controlled by Germany and Portugal, Namibia was controlled by South Africa from 1915 until 1990.

A unique part of Namibia's geography is the largest sand dunes in the world. The huge sand dunes stretch all along the Atlantic Coast of Namibia and are called the Namib Desert. Geologists tell us that the Namib Desert is the oldest desert in

the world. This desert is part of Africa's largest game preserve, Namib-Naukluft National Park. The desert and its dunes are not just tan or grey in color like ordinary sand. The sand has pretty colors that include shades of pink and orange.

The Namib Desert has the same types of creatures that live in deserts around the world. These include lizards, snakes and a few small animals like meerkats. This desert also contains large creatures including ostriches, Oryx gazelles, and a species of elephant that has adapted to living in the desert.

The famous Kalahari Desert is found in eastern Namibia. The Kalahari Desert stretches into the countries of Botswana and South Africa. The Kalahari isn't as dry as other deserts. After the rainy season in the Kalahari, there is enough grass for grazing animals and their predators. Some common African animals that live in the wetter parts of the Kalahari include lions, jackals, giraffes and antelope.
