Understanding Simple, Compound, and Run-On Sentences

A **simple sentence** contains one complete thought.

A **compound sentence** is two complete thoughts connected by a comma and a coordinating conjunction (for, and, nor, but, or, yet, so).

A **run-on sentence** contains two complete thoughts that are not joined together properly.
