## *Avoiding Run-On Sentences*

Run-on sentences occur when two or more independent clauses are not joined together properly. These mistakes often happen when:

- The new thought begins with a pronoun.
- The new thought begins with a transitional expression or conjunctive adverb.
- The new thought begins with a directional word such as then.

There are four ways of correcting run-on sentences:

- Separate the two sentences using a period.  
(Ex: Today was very hot. It was 100 degrees.)
- Make a compound sentence.  
(Ex: Kelly likes pizza, but Ally likes to eat hotdogs.)
- Connect the two ideas with a semi-colon.  
(Ex: It was very hot today; it was 100 degrees.)
- Create a complex sentence.  
(Ex: Kelly likes pizza; however, Ally likes to eat hotdogs.)  
(Ex: Although I like to play tennis, Ally likes to play basketball.)
