The indefinite pronouns *all, any, more, most, none, and some* may be either singular or plural depending on their meaning in a sentence.

Examples: <u>One</u> of the players <u>looks</u> great on the field. (singular) <u>Many</u> of the players <u>are</u> not trying. (plural) <u>Most</u> of the fans <u>are</u> getting discouraged. (plural) <u>All</u> of the crowd <u>wants</u> to see them win. (singular)
